

# Kentucky Cycling Challenge

Bike Walk Kentucky organized the Kentucky Cycling Challenge again this year to promote cycling and support local cycling events. The events in all five participating communities are now complete.

A premier challenge with routes across Kentucky since 2013,

Over 3,500 cyclists visited these communities from almost every U.S. state and at least 3 countries, toured the beautiful environs and left feeling inspired by and connected to these communities, all while making an economic impact. (We will

have more information on the impact of the Challenge in upcoming newsletters.) This year, 25 cyclists completed all 5 rides and earned a jersey and bibs, 37 cyclists completed 4 rides and earned a jersey, and 30 cyclists completed at least 3 rides.





### **Kentucky Complete Streets** Manual Wins National Award

Kentucky is again proving itself as a national model for developing safer and more inclusive infrastructure. Kentucky's new "Complete Streets, Roads, and Highways Manual" has earned a National Recognition Award in the American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) 2023 Engineering Excellence Awards (EEA) competition—the "Academy Awards of the engineering industry."

Keith Lovan, Vice President of Bike Walk Kentucky, is also the project manager of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's (KYTC) Complete Streets, Roads, and Highways Manual. Keith received an American Council for Engineering Companies of Kentucky (ACEC) Engineering Excellence Award in March at Buffalo Trace and traveled to Washington, D.C. to receive national recognition at the ACEC Engineering Excellence Awards Gala.
